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# Gallery of Romanticism

## Seeing Caspar David Friedrich

Born in Greifswald in 1774, Caspar David Friedrich is now the most famous German artist of the 19th century, and is the focus of the new Gallery of Romanticism. The new permanent exhibition shows how his view of nature revolutionized landscape painting.

A chapel installation serves as a multimedia work of art, setting the scene for Friedrich's poetic imagery in the works that follow. Visitors can immerse themselves in his originals and experience how his paintings took shape. The exhibition traces the life and work of the son of a soap boiler from Swedish Pomerania, revealing what kind of person and painter he was. His home region inspired him throughout his life – and continues to fascinate to this day. An interactive colour scale leads visitors to Friedrich's motifs in Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania and invites them to rediscover his iconic landscapes.

# Land by the Sea

The Baltic Sea unites, divides, and shapes the Pomeranian region. Discover its eventful history, which begins with the settlement and transformation of the landscape by Stone Age people. In the Middle Ages, there was intensive exchange between Slavic and Scandinavian cultures, followed by the Griffin dynasty's rule for over 500 years, which is immortalized on the huge Croy Tapestry.



During the Thirty Years' War, Sweden and Brandenburg divided the area between them, and from 1815 onwards, the whole of Pomerania became a Prussian province. After the First World War, the region bordered the newly founded Second Polish Republic. Just a few months after the German invasion of Poland in 1939, anti-Semitic deportations began.

The border shifts after 1945 were accompanied by a fundamental population exchange. The exhibition presents perspectives from the FRG, the GDR, and Poland, and culminates with the region's convergence from 1989 and Poland's accession to the Schengen area in 2007.
