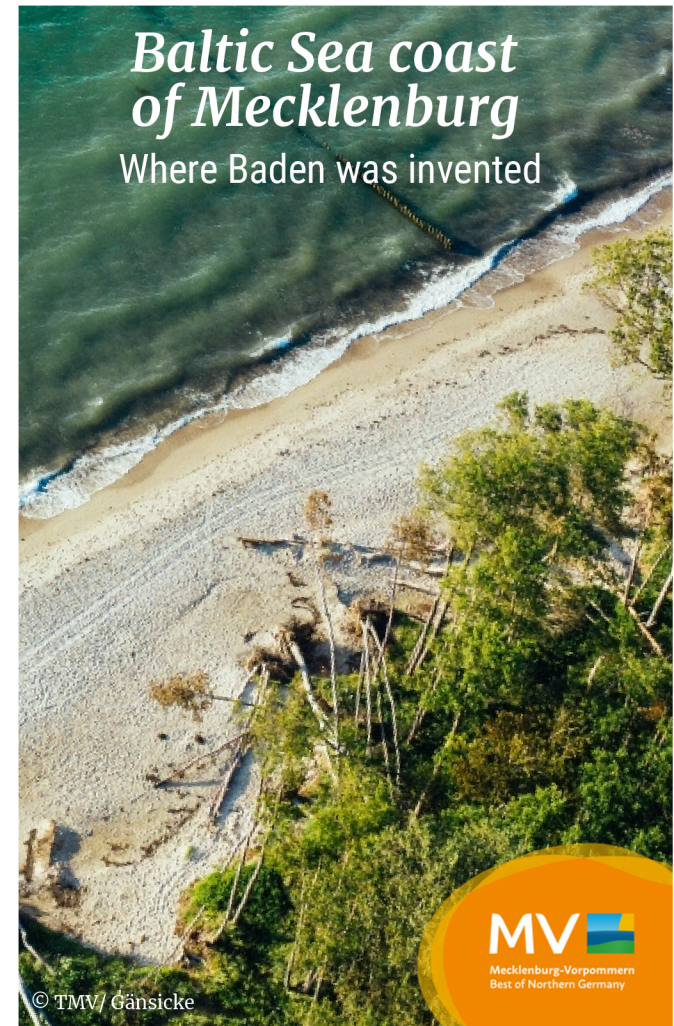

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Interesting facts about the Baltic Sea coast of Mecklenburg

- 1 Germany's highest located lighthouse "Buk" in Bastorf
- 2 Island Langenwerder - first bird sanctuary in the county on the island of Poel
- 3 Bothmer palace - the largest baroque palace complex in Mecklenburg
- 4 Seaside resort of Kühlungsborn - Germany's longest beach promenade meets typical spa architecture
- 5 Heiligendamm - first seaside resort founded in 1973
- 6 Monastery of Rehna - largest monastery complex in Mecklenburg-Western Pomerania
- 7 "Rostocker Heide" - the largest continuous coastal forest of Germany
- 8 Hanseatic City of Rostock with the oldest university in the Baltic sea region founded in 1419
- 9 Hanseatic City of Wismar - UNESCO World Heritage City since 2002
- 10 "Bäderbahn Molli" - one of Germany's oldest narrow gauge, steam driven train that connects the Baltic Sea with Bad Doberan; the Minster of Bad Doberan is known for the richest medieval interior in Europe
