Mecklenburg-Vorpommern positively abounds with water, boasting 2,000 kilometres of coastline and 2,000 lakes. The Mecklenburg Lake District, for instance, is part of Germany's greater <u>Lakes Region</u>. So it was only a matter of time before renowned water experts chose Mecklenburg-Vorpommern as a travel destination. According to the tourist board of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern, the sea god Neptune recently spent his holidays here, as documented in voice and image (<u>youtube.com</u>) in the new promotional film, created by the agency Molle&Korn. Neptune is brought to life by actor Christoph Franken. The musical piece 'Acquamarina' is by Erobique.

This coming season, guests in this holiday region will find lots of new things to discover – and water is usually not far away. For example, visitors to the Baltic resort town of Prerow will be able to saunter across the sea on the newly built longest pier in Germany, discover the noble state capital Schwerin, a UNESCO World Heritage city, or watch the stars from one of the new bubble tents at Schloss Krugsdorf on Stettin Bay. Here and there, historic buildings radiate with new splendour, some of them with the help of world-renowned artists. In Schwerin Cathedral, the windows designed by Günter Uecker will be consecrated on 1 December. Here are a few of the new attractions:

Experience between land and sea: the longest sea bridge in Prerow now open

After more than two years of construction, the new sea bridge and associated island harbour at the Baltic resort town of Prerow opened on October 16th. At 720 metres, it is the longest sea bridge on the Baltic coast. The island harbour offers berths for 40 sport boats, three fishing boats and the rescue cruiser. The new structure had to be built because the former harbour for the rescue cruiser, the emergency port Darßer Ort, is located in the core of the Vorpommersche Boddenlandschaft national park. From the rooftop terrace atop the harbour building at the head of the sea bridge,

guests have a 360-degree view of the coast and all the way to Hiddensee island. Talks are underway about a future ferry line from here to Klintholm on the Danish island of Møn.

Greifswald: Galerie der Romantik to open in 2025

Vorpommern is again making headlines as a place of Romanticism. The goal is to permanently establish Greifswald as the official Caspar-David-Friedrich city and the Pomeranian State Museum as the cultural beacon of Romanticism in the North. In this context, the Galerie der Romantik (Gallery of Romanticism) is scheduled to open at the Pomeranian State Museum in the Hanseatic city in 2025. The gallery will show works by the painter, graphic artist and illustrator Caspar David Friedrich. Visitors can look forward to an installation where Friedrich's paintings, mood lighting and photographs of the places that inspired him blend together. A graphics cabinet will show a changing selection from the vast store of Friedrich's drawings, watercolours and print graphics, as well as the collection of letters between Friedrich and his siblings. The cabinet focuses on Caspar David Friedrich the man, as well as his contemporaries Philipp Otto Runge, Friedrich August von Klinkowström, Johan Christian Dahl and Carl Gustav Carus.

Staatliches Museum Schwerin to reopen in October 2025 after comprehensive renovations

Also scheduled for 2025 is the reopening of the Staatliches Museum Schwerin (State Museum Schwerin), located between the state theatre and the castle. The newly presented collection will show art from several periods from Cranach to Duchamp. The exhibition concept will be more child and family friendly, more digital, more interactive and also more accessible. The Marcel Duchamp collection, for example, comprises 91 works, making it one of the largest and most significant worldwide. Another new feature is the format called 'Guests from around the world'. This special exhibit will show outstanding works of art from international museums at regular intervals, among them three paintings by Rembrandt. A special treat for all guests: for the first four years, admission to the museum will be free, made possible by the Dorit & Alexander Otto Foundation and the State of Mecklenburg-Vorpommern.

Liturgical consecration of the stained-glass windows designed by Günter Uecker in Schwerin Cathedral on 1 December

On 1 December at 10am, Schwerin's cathedral community will be celebrating the liturgical consecration of the four stained-glass windows designed by Günther Uecker. The artist chose the title 'Lichtbogen', which translates to 'Arc of light', for the four windows, two in the southern and two in the northern wing of the transept of Schwerin Cathedral. The 130 glass sections adding up to 62 square metres will soon radiate in blue light. The team of glass studio Derix in Taunusstein transferred the cloth drafts to glass in an elaborate process. Günther Uecker accompanied the work and has confirmed his presence at the consecration ceremony. This consecration is the second of its kind: in April of this year, the 'Fenster für bewegtes Licht' (Windows for moving light) designed by Olafur Eliasson were consecrated at Greifswald Cathedral during a festive service.

Since July 2024, visitors can already enjoy a walk through the newly opened exhibits in this comprehensively modernised branch of the Deutsche Meeresmuseum – at half the usual price of admission.

Kühlungsborn: Villa Astoria now a boutique hotel

Schwerin: from state bank to boutique hotel Tresor

The former state bank of the German Democratic Republic in the centre of the state capital Schwerin will be turned into a four star superior luxury hotel named 'Hotel Tresor'. The bank offices will become guest rooms. A restaurant, a bistro serving French cuisine and a café are also planned. In total, 104 rooms are to be created, and eight of them will be accessible rooms. There will also be three conference rooms in the former directors' rooms with an attached suite. The property was built between 1905 and 1911. The hotel should be completed by the middle of next year. It is owned and operated by Cavallo Hotel GmbH, under management by AHC International Consulting AG.

Hering from the Baltic Sea, salami from Poseritz or lamb from Mönchgut. The kitchen is directed by Maria Decker together with Damon Budd from Christchurch in New Zealand. But the Onda has more to offer than just a place for culinary delights: there is also a multi-purpose room with unique features like a baking room for the handcrafted sourdough bread by the Hofbrot bakery and a showroom for the handmade custom loudspeakers by the company Inselklang.

THE RESET: medicinal fasting in the refurbished Groß Plasten palace

After refurbishment, the Groß Plasten palace dating back to 1751 was re-opened as a fasting hotel called 'THE RESET'. In the palace located near Waren (Müritz) in the Mecklenburg Lake District, the physician and managing director Miguel Schleiss and interior designer and managing director Doris Schleiss offer classic therapeutic fasting cures and detox treatments. Visitors can also book short stays to enjoy reduced organic foods served at the hotel's restaurant 'THE RESET CULINARY ART', which is accessible exclusively to hotel guests. There are 52 rooms located in the main building and the adjacent coach house. The fasting cures are monitored by physicians. In addition to the daily exercise programme, the Kneipp treatments and relaxation exercises, there are also special treatments like whole body, Ayurveda and sound bowl massages. A spa area with pool, sauna and infrared booth will be completed soon. The concept is rounded out with yoga retreats and a women's health retreat.

New accommodation: bubble tents at Schloss Krugsdorf

At Schloss Krugsdorf on the edge of the Stettin Bay nature preserve, guests can enjoy a new unique kind of accommodation. They can book one of two bubble tents, which are spherical, transparent tents kept firmly upright with a constant stream of air. The transparent shell allows for an unobstructed view of the starry night sky. The tents are located in isolated wellness gardens with hammocks, hot tub, solar shower and sauna. Guests can either prepare their own meals in the outdoor kitchen, book the buffet in the hotel or enjoy a candlelit dinner prepared by gourmet chef Rainer Wolter. Overnight guests also enjoy a 50 per cent discount for the use of the adjacent 18-hole

Night sky over Binz: new 'Sun, Moon and Stars Trail' on Schmachter Lake

In cooperation with physicist Dr Michael Danielides, the new 'Sun, Moon and Stars Trail' with 12 stations is currently being built along the walking path on Schmachter Lake in Binz. Each station has a North Star post with a star chart adaptable to the season, providing orientation in the night sky over Binz. An information board about the solar system, an overview map of the trail and a photo display near the view tower on Schmachter Lake provide an introduction to the topic. The location for the 'Sun, Moon and Stars Trail' was chosen in part because of the comparatively low light pollution in this area, which is a great advantage for star gazing.

August: Sailing regatta "SailGP" in Sassnitz

On August 16 and 17, the international sailing event "SailGP" will be held in Germany for the first time: in Sassnitz on the island of Rügen. During the 2024/2025 season of the popular format, the regatta will visit a total of 14 stations in addition to Sassnitz, among them Dubai, Sydney, Los Angeles, New York, and Rio de Janeiro. The competition has twelve national teams facing off in catamarans. One of these is the German team with Erik Heil, two-time Olympic bronze winner, at the helm. September: "ÖTILLÖ Swimrun" on Rügen

Premiere on Rügen: On September 13, the island will host the international sporting format "ÖTILLÖ Swimrun" for the first time. The event originated in Sweden, and combines running and swimming

races into one competition. Athletes can choose from three different race formats: In the "ÖTILLÖ Swimrun Experience", participants can compete on a starting distance of nine kilometres with easy swimming portions in the Baltic Sea and runs through the Granitz forest. The short-distance race "ÖTILLÖ Swimrun Sprint" takes contestants on a 22-kilometre course through Granitz forest, Lanken-Granitz, Seedorf, and Sellin. Both races begin and end at the Ostseebad Binz seaside resort. The "ÖTILLÖ Swimrun World Series" is a long-distance race of over 42.5 kilometres from Klein Zicker through Mönchgut and Sellin to Binz. Around 500 participants are expected, starting both individually and in two-person teams. The sporting event is organised and managed by a collaboration of the Mönchgut-Granitz GmbH infrastructure association and Binzer Bucht Tourismus.
